

## IBC Purchasing Guide

Tank Management Services purchases suitable steel or plastic pallet IBCs that are no longer required. Once received the IBCs are cleaned, tested and supplied back into the market for reuse.

## IBC Collection Terms and Conditions

1. Maximum collection period is 30 days.
2. IBCs are in re-usable condition.
3. IBCs must be completely drained and empty. Maximum residue is 1kg.
4. IBC to be free of outside residue or contamination.
5. Lids and caps are to be screwed onto the IBC and tightened to create a seal.
6. The former contents of the IBC need to be clearly indicated on the IBC labels and be legible. No other product shall be in the IBC other than the product shown on the labelling.
7. MSDS to be provided by the end user of the product is classified as Dangerous Goods.
8. If the IBC has contained toxic, carcinogenic, mutagenic or any other highly hazardous material then the IBC shall be neutralised so as not to pose a risk to any person coming into contact with the IBC. If you are unsure of the contents suitability contact TMS for further advice.
9. The end user undertakes to ensure that the IBCs ready for collection and meet the collection criteria. Should an IBC fail to meet one of the collection conditions TMS are entitled to refuse to accept the container or subsequently to charge the end user for costs incurred.
10. If the IBCs do meet these conditions TMS is authorised to:
  - a. Reject pick up of non conforming IBCs or return them to the sender at the senders cost.
  - b. Charge the end user for the disposal of product residues or non re-usable IBCs.
  - c. Charge freight expenses where the number of IBCs collected does meet the number on the collection request.
11. In placing a collection request, the end user automatically accepts the collection conditions and promises to pay the costs incurred in case of non-compliance. The end user is liable for all manner of damage caused during the handling – appropriate or otherwise – of containers and their contents in preparation for their collection. All relevant national and international legislation and regulations must be observed at all times.
